


















More than 70 Pre-K through 5th grade students participated in Curiosity Fair and showcased their knowledge on some of their favorite topics. Great job everyone!






































































For the past nine years we've been going to the same school, And our lives circled together like a whirlpool, As we move on, our friendships may rearrange, But our history together will never change.
