I. Call to Order 6:30 pm Opening Prayer

- Approval of Agenda: Moved by Baca, Seconded by Kelly, no objections Approved.

II. Open Public Forum 6:35 pm

- Vice Principal Christine Spevacek was present for this meeting via Zoom, thank you for ioining us.
- ASC email and/or in-person parent comments/concerns
 - 1. Demerits and dress code.
 - a. <u>Demerits</u> Cameron offered thoughts from parents that she has received, including that some feel demerits are a "joke," they are ineffective, and that they target boys and "neuroatypical" children. In depth discussion regarding discipline and demerits with Spevacek and Zobel offered helpful insights into understanding these issues. Discussion of who can give out demerits, how many demerits earn a detention, and options available during detention service projects or quietly sitting before school. Discussion of the goals of discipline and how it fits into our Catholic faith.
 - b. <u>Dress Code</u> Spevacek and Zobel again provided additional insight into the discipline protocols and how issues are addressed. In-depth discussion regarding the dress code occurred with Spevacek and Zobel offering helpful insights into understanding these issues. Winter weather health concerns and compliance issues related to shorts/skirts combined with sweatpants for recess in winter drove the change in policy. The school purchased new skirts/shorts to provide to students whose clothing is habitually not compliant with the dress code. Additional concerns of appropriate clothing appear on "out of uniform" days. The new policy provides greater

clarification of student expectations regarding dressing appropriately for the weather. Further discussion of potential underlying causes of uniform non-compliance and how best to address those issues, including offering counseling, were discussed.

2. First day drop off. There are reports of parents being put off by being unable to walk their kindergartener into school on their first day. We again discussed the balance of security and community connectedness/student retention, seeking to find a solution. Zobel is open to finding a solution that would allow new families to walk their children into the classroom on the first day or first week of school. Having student ambassadors at the doors to assist new students was discussed and may be an option. This issue will be re-visited by administration.

III. New Business 7:30 pm

- Academic acknowledgement in the Weekender Cameron raised the point that we should be celebrating the successes of our students and should consider putting the Honor Roll recipients in the Weekender newsletter.
- Picture day new company option Scherf presented information about a new vendor that
 we could consider for our school pictures, Slow Road Photos. Discussion of the costs and
 quality of the pictures led the group to agree that once the contract with Lifetouch expires
 that the administration should look again at this vendor.
