• Principal's Report

• DWAS Update - Biggest year, estimate \$125,000 in gross earnings (increase in \$30k from previous year)

• Matrix/letter feedback - Email update to follow to improve communication. Consideration given to rolling out after discussion with ASC. Demerits have decreased in comparison to the first 2 quarters. Qualitative reports from teachers indicate students are more responsive to warnings. Reflection sheets offer opportunity for restorative conversations between students and peers/teachers.

 Nonpublic School Funding Update - Discussed proposed cuts to funding. The effect on Annunciation would be in textbook dollars, counseling funds for 7th and 8th graders, and nursing support. Estimates indicate approx \$540 per student in lost assistance. Administrators are lobbying but encourage phone calls by all to local legislators.

• Cold Weather - Typically do not follow MPS. School admin evaluates other private and public schools along with staffing considerations for those traveling a distance as well as daycare needs. For cold weather, the preference is to make the call in the evening. -35 F windchill is often the cutoff for many districts to consider closing and delaying.

• 2025-2026 School Calendar - NCEA conference will be held in Minneapolis April 7-9,2026. Archbishop Hebda is requesting attendance. All teaching staff would be required to attend for professional development. Question if extended day would be open for 4/7 and 4/8. • Improv and Spring Musical

- Spring Musical: Large interest, 68 auditioned for stage roles and everyone will have a role in the show.

- Improv: Discussion around future of improv with possibility of utilizing the spring musical as a replacement legacy activity for middle school students. Proposed small improv show this year with opportunity for feedback on continuing. Council supports allowing Ms. Stang curriculum and creative control.

Uniform Update: Work towards a uniform vs a dress code in order to unify and reduce exclusion. Discussion regarding cost to families and how to phase in
